

BRICS, SCO are attempts to create new intl. order

The Secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council (SNSC) Ali Akbar Ahmadian says that the groups of states such as BRICS and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) are attempts to tackle unilateralism.

Speaking to Iranian journalists on Tuesday in Moscow, where he arrived to attend the 13th International Meeting of High Representatives for Security Issues, the top Iranian security official, the SNSC secretary Ahmadian said that "The formation of groups of countries such as BRICS, Shanghai Cooperation Organization, and other new efforts that have begun in the world are aimed at creating a new system against the current unilateral order."

He said that such multilateral organizations have offered new opportunities to other nations, which need to be increased.

Ahmadian also said that he is scheduled to hold meetings with participating officials of other countries on the sidelines of the event.

The 13th International Meeting of High Representatives for Security Issues will be held at the National Centre RUSSIA in Moscow from May 27 to 29, 2025 under the chairmanship of the Secretary of the Security Council of the Russian Federation, Sergei Shoigu.

More than 129 delegations from 105 countries — members of BRICS, the SCO, ASEAN, the CIS, the League of Arab States, the African Union, the CSTO, and other international organizations — have confirmed their participation in the forum.

The agenda of the meeting of high representatives will focus on matters of international cooperation in the field of security. In particular, discussions will center around the formation of a new architecture of equal and indivisible security that is fairer and better suited to modern realities, according to Russia EXPO website.

Yemeni military targets two areas in Tel Aviv with missiles

The spokesman of the Yemeni military says that the Yemeni armed forces targeted two areas in the Zionist regime's capital of Tel Aviv with hypersonic missiles on Tuesday.

In a statement on Tuesday, the Yemeni armed forces spokesman Brigadier General Yahya Saree said that the Yemenis targeted two areas in Tel Aviv in occupied territories with Palestine-2 hypersonic missile and Zolfiqar missile. According to Saree, the Yemeni military targeted the Ben Gurion International Airport in the suburb of Tel Aviv with Palestine-2 hypersonic missile and the a vital target in Jaffa in the eastern suburb of Tel Aviv.

The missile attacks caused air traffic and a pause in Ben Gurion Airport while sent millions of Zionists to shelters. The Yemenis target occupied territories under the occupation of the Zionist Israeli regime in solidarity with Palestinians in Gaza that have been facing a genocidal campaign by the Zionist regime.



A judge is assassinated in Shiraz

Officials launched a probe into the attack, which killed a young judge in Shiraz. Shiraz, IRNA — The head of Branch 102 of the Criminal Court 2 in the southern Iranian city of Shiraz has been assassinated, according to a provincial official. Sadrollah Rajaei-Nasab, a judicial official in the Fars Province, said on Tuesday that two individuals killed Judge Ehsan Bagheri while he was en route to work. Authorities have launched an investigation to identify the perpetrators. Judge Bagheri was 38 years old and had over 12 years of judicial experience. In reaction to the terror attack, Judiciary Chief Qolam-Hossein Mohseni-Ejei urged authorities to swiftly investigate the assassination.

President Pezeshkian:

Iran-Oman ties expanding on daily basis

Ahead of his trip to Muscat, Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian stressed that the bilateral relations between Iran and Oman are expanding day by day.

Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, speaking before departing for Oman, stated that his visit is taking place at the invitation of Sultan Haitham bin Tariq of Oman. The trip aligns with the general policies set by the Leader of the Islamic Revolution, aimed at fostering strong relations with neighboring countries.

"We are pursuing the best possible relations with our neighbors," Pezeshkian said, highlighting cooperation in scientific, economic, and trade sectors.

He noted that regional peace, particularly developments in Palestine, would also be discussed during the visit in order to reach a common understanding. The president stressed the need for regional unity in the face of Israeli atrocities. "No sane and conscientious person can accept or tolerate the brutal acts committed by the Zionists," he said. "We must stand united and continue to protest through international institutions."

Referring to the \$2.3 billion trade volume between Iran and Oman, Pezeshkian emphasized the growing bilateral ties and said that the trip would include



discussions on shipping, trade, science, technology, industry, and investment relations.

Pezeshkian said that the purpose of his visit is to Oman is to strengthen friendly relations and increase bilateral cooperation between the two nations. Tehran, IRNA — President Masoud Pezeshkian, ahead of his official visit to Oman, has emphasized the need for expanding Iran's bilateral cooperation with the Persian Gulf state. Before leaving for the Omani capital, Muscat, on Tuesday, Pezeshkian said that the purpose of his trip was part of Iran's policies to establish better and broader relations with its neighbors. He hailed the growing relations of the Islamic Republic in political, economic, cultural, and scientific fields with regional countries.

"We have a trade volume of nearly 2.3 billion dollars with Oman, which is

increasing day by day," he

said.

Pezeshkian's two-day visit, at the invitation of Sultan Haitham bin Tariq Al Said, will see the inking of several cooperation documents and discussions related to roads, shipping, and trade relations.

Iranian and Omani officials will also discuss ways to strengthening peace and tranquility in the region and confronting the crimes that are taking place in Gaza. Pezeshkian has already called on regional countries to join hands against the Israeli regime's criminal behavior.

This trip is in response to Sultan Haitham's state visit to Tehran two years ago that followed the visit of late President Ebrahim Raisi to Muscat.

The coordination between the armed forces of Iran and Pakistan in border control has been effective and valuable, and this cooperation should be promoted, Bagheri noted.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson :

Iran will neither compromise on its enrichment right nor give in to bullies

Baqaei cautioned that Iran-U.S. talks could encounter problems if the intention was to deprive Iranians of their right to peaceful nuclear energy.

Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmaeil Baqaei reaffirms Iran's commitment to its right to uranium enrichment, saying that Tehran will not relinquish this right under any circumstances. Baqaei responded to the recent U.S. demand for a complete halt to the enrichment process during an interview with CNN correspondent Frederik Pleitgen in Tehran on Monday.

In response to a question regarding the progress in indirect Iran-U.S. talks, he said if the intention was to make sure that Tehran's nuclear program would not be weaponized, that's simple. If the U.S.'s intention is to deprive Iranians of their right to peaceful nuclear energy, it would be highly problematic and could seriously jeopardize the entire negotiation process, he



cautioned.

He said that there are many ways to achieve a compromise since Iran's nuclear program is entirely peaceful and Tehran is committed to keeping it that way. The fact that talks have continued so far means there is a certain level of understanding, Baqaei emphasized when he was asked about the Trump administration and its negotiator's stance on Iran's red lines.

Referring to threats and pressure, the spokesperson under-

lined that the Iranians will not yield to any kind of bullying and will respond decisively to defend their national security.

Iran and the United States have held five rounds of talks —three in Muscat and two in Rome— mediated by Omani Foreign Minister Sayyid Badr Al-Busaidi. After the talks inched forward with the fifth round in Rome on Friday, President Donald Trump voiced optimism that progress was being made in "very good" talks with the Iranian delegation.
